Curriculum Overview

Module 1 | Care of Children and Young People: Healthy School Child

Module 1 Delves into caring for children and young people in schools, addressing mental health, communication, special needs, and common health issues.

Module 2 | Introductory Guides

Module 3 | Being a General Practitioner

Module 16 covers critical aspects of acute care, including managing major incidents, treating burns and scalds in primary care, assessing limb injuries, and addressing head injuries effectively in primary care settings.

Module 17 | Care of Children and Young People: Neonates and Infants

Module 17 provides comprehensive guidance on neonatal and infant care, covering a wide range of common issues from breathing problems to behavioural concerns, including case studies on acute wheezing.

Module 18 | Care of Children and Young People: Adolescent Healthcare

Module 24 covers essential aspects of end-of-life care, including principles of palliative care, pain management, common symptoms, emergencies, final days, difficult conversations, ethical considerations, psychosocial aspects, and medico-legal concerns.

Module 25 | Care of People with Intellectual Disability
